

NM Healthcare Epidemiology and Infection Prevention Inpatient Care Information for ROCOVID-19 and COVID-19 Patients

- This virus is transmitted by droplets. Patients are to be managed with Droplet and Contact precautions (procedure mask, gown, gloves) and eye protection, except in an ICU setting or when an aerosol generating procedure (AGP) takes place then use an N95 respirator or PAPR instead of a procedure mask.
- Patients are to be placed in private rooms with the door closed

An a	irborne infection isolation room (AIIR) is not recommended by CDC unless the patient will be undergoing an
AGP	. The collection of a NP or OP swab is not an aerosol generating procedure.
	Place the appropriate Precaution sign outside the room door
	If performing an AGP use the N95 respirator (PPE Guidelines – What to Use and When to Use it).
	If performing an AGP place the "Patient Received Aerosol Generating Procedure (AGP)" sign outside the room
	door with times documented
	Stock all required PPE
	 N95 Respirators or Procedural mask
	 Gowns
	o Gloves
	 Goggles or face shield that covers front and sides of the face. Personal eyeglasses are not a substitute
	for goggles or a face shield.
	 See the <u>Safe PPE Use and Reuse</u> as needed
	Limit the number of staff caring for patients per shift as feasible according to staffing, training, and
	competencies
	 Dietary should drop trays off with the assigned nurse
	o Phlebotomists should collect blood cultures only; if possible, nurse to collect all other blood specimens
	 Nurse to help with daily cleaning (pull trash and wipe surfaces when in room for patient care)
	Post <u>CDC Donning and Doffing Guidelines</u> in a sheet protector in the anteroom or outside of the roomdoor
	Double-bag lab specimens before using the pneumatic tube system to transport specimens to the lab
	Dedicate equipment to the patient whenever possible
	 Any equipment that cannot be dedicated to the patient should be cleaned and disinfected per standard
	procedure
	Place disposable stethoscope in patient room

Important Reminders

- When donning and doffing PPE, take special care to follow <u>CDC Donning and Doffing Guidelines</u> to not contaminate yourself in the process. See <u>NM Videos</u>.
- Standard hospital-approved disinfectant wipes are appropriate for disinfecting equipment and surfaces
- All procedures should be performed at the bedside whenever possible.
- If a patient needs to be transported to another location, receiving departments must be notified of patient's
 isolation precautions. See the PPE Guidelines What to Use and When to Use it for guidance on PPE during
 patient transport and procedures
- Linen requires no special handling
