

May 26: COVID-19 Clinical Update Ambulatory Testing

This daily communication is intended to facilitate the sharing of important clinical information during the COVID-19 healthcare crisis and to help respond to questions from physicians across Northwestern Medicine.

NEW AMBULATORY TESTING CRITERIA

Last Friday, May 22, Northwestern Medicine updated testing criteria to allow all outpatients who have COVID-19-related symptoms to get tested. Ambulatory physicians can place an order in Epic for the SARS-CoV-2 test at **Alternate Test Sites**.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention defines COVID-19 symptoms as the following:

- Cough (new or worsening)
- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath
- Chills
- Loss of smell or taste in the last 14 days
- Muscle pain
- Fever
- Vomiting or diarrhea
